






- Remarkable differences in economic performance country by country = weak economic cohesion within the macro-region
- Many small countries, long borders (bordering effects: low level of economic performance and cooperation – with exceptions: good examples)
- Large number of the cities (the engines of economic performance) are situated in border regions with repressed functionality – with exceptions: good examples
- Reluctant SMEs in settling down abroad because of lack of knowledge



- To compile the good examples from the Danube region and share them
- To create and develop further a knowledge base at macro-regional level
- To improve the attractiveness of the borderlands within the Danube region
- To develop tools and services which can facilitate the integration of the resources from two sides of the border and, this way, to weaken separating effects of the borders
