

Opportunities in internet-supported active aging for retired professors

These initiatives often emphasize maintaining access to institutional IT post-retirement (like university email and resources).

Opportunities:

- Advocate for continued access to university digital infrastructure, facilitating ongoing research, emailing, and participation in academic networks.

- Engage in online projects that bridge generations (e.g., mentoring students or younger professionals through online platforms).

- Join or co-create interlinked academic and community websites to foster wider collaboration.

3. Lifelong Learning & Teaching Online

Online Courses & Virtual Teaching

Retired professors can both take and teach digital courses online. Platforms for lifelong learning (e.g., MOOCs, university continuing education portals) are increasingly popular among older adults and allow retired professors to: Refresh skills or learn new ones (e.g., digital tools, AI, online pedagogy). Design and deliver online courses or guest lectures based on their subject expertise.

Opportunities:

Offer online master classes or short courses for other retired professionals or the general public.

Join international online teaching platforms that focus on adult education.

4. Community & Public Engagement via Internet

Events & Workshops Promoting Digital Inclusion

Various calls and initiatives (e.g., in Slovenia and across the EU) fund or support events where older adults — including retired professors — can lead or host digital literacy workshops, seminars, and community learning events.

Opportunities:

Apply to organize events that teach digital literacy or highlight the role of knowledge and technology in aging.

Use online platforms to disseminate educational content that helps other older adults improve digital competence.

5. AI & Emerging Tech Engagement

Digital & AI Literacy

Retired professors can engage with AI and other emerging technologies — both as learners and contributors:

Use AI tools to enhance research, writing, and idea exploration.

Participate in discussions about technology's role in society and aging.

Opportunities:

Conduct or publish thought pieces or online lectures on the ethical, educational, or societal impact of technology.

Offer AI & digital literacy training sessions for peers in their communities.

6. Research & Civic Technology Projects

Digital tools and online platforms enable retired professors to contribute to research or community projects aimed at improving the lives of older adults (e.g., AR/VR tools for learning, crowdsourcing platforms for civic engagement). Academic literature highlights how technologies can support meaningful activities and participation for older adults.

Opportunities:

Collaborate with research teams on participatory technology design for older populations.

Mentor graduate students in digital ageing research via remote collaboration tools.

7. Consulting & Advisory Roles

Because of decades of expertise, retired professors can work as online consultants or expert advisors:

Serve on virtual advisory boards for nonprofits, research groups, or startups focused on aging technologies.

Offer remote consulting on policy, education, or digital transformation.

8. Potential Funding & Project Support

Even if specific programs target broader older adult participation or workforce engagement (e.g., Project Support to companies for extending work activity - ASI+ 2025–2029 in Slovenia supports continued activity and skills training for older workers), retired academics can often participate or be invited to contribute as trainers, speakers, or evaluators in such funded projects.

Opportunities:

Get involved as trainers or content experts in project-funded programs that enhance digital and lifelong learning skills for seniors.

Help shape project curricula or evaluation frameworks through remote collaboration.

Examples of networks and associations

5. California State University Emeritus & Retired Faculty and Staff Association

A US state-level nonprofit that supports emeritus faculty and staff, including networking, newsletters, advocacy, and member services.

6. University of Manitoba Retirees Association (via Emeriti & Senior Scholars)

Offers online and offline programming, mentorship opportunities, newsletters, and shared resources for emeriti scholars.

7. ACADEMICUS – Club of Retired Professors, University of Rijeka

10. International Political Science Association (IPSA)
